COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

In accordance with **DHA and KHDA Protocols** and regular School consultations with authorities, providing Health and Safety for all school process participants and preventing the spread of Covid-19, the below **Guidelines** are to be adhered by **Parents and Students**.

*Parents are requested to consider the sensitivities around COVID-19, to avoid stigma and panicking situations. There are dedicated teams from **DHA and KHDA** as well as the **Health and Safety Team at School** ready to support you.*

What does COVID-19 Positive mean?

Someone who tests **positive** for COVID-19 after a **PCR test**.

What is a Primary (Close) Contact of a COVID-19 Positive case?

In the **Home setting**, a Primary (Close) Contact is a **direct family member** and/or people living in the same house who spend a significant amount of time together in close contact.

At **School Premises**, the DHA would consider a Primary (Close) Contact to be anyone who has spent **15 consecutive minutes or longer within 2 metres** of another person who tests positive for COVID-19.

What is a Secondary Contact?

A Secondary Contact is anyone who has been **in contact with a Primary (Close) Contact**.

As per DHA Protocol, the Close Contact cases are:

- people who were in close proximity (less than 2 meters) from a confirmed COVID-19 case, for a period of more than 15 minutes starting from 2 days before symptoms begin appearing in the confirmed case and/or throughout the duration of the illness.

Identifying Close Contact cases:

1. Living in the same household with a COVID-19 case.
2. Sitting next to the case in the bus or class.
3. Being in close proximity (less than 2m) with the confirmed case for a period of more than 15 minutes.
4. Physically touching a person who has COVID-19 (for example shaking hands without washing or sanitizing afterwards).
5. Sharing or holding items after a COVID-19 case and not washing/sanitizing your hands afterwards.
6. Eating together (either side by side or across the table) in close proximity, (less than 2m apart) or sharing utensils.

What would happen if a family member of the RIS student tests positive for COVID-19?

If a **Parent/Sibling** tests **positive** for **COVID-19**, all **family members** of the household are considered **Primary (Close) Contacts** and must **isolate for 14 days** at home.

As per DHA Protocol:

- **PCR test is not mandatory** for **Close Contacts**. Monitoring to look for symptoms is necessary. A **PCR test** must be taken **if symptoms develop**.
- COVID-19 Nasal Swab **PCR test is not required** for Student/Staff who is identified as a **Close Contact**, unless the Student/Staff develops signs and symptoms, but completion of **14 days' quarantine is mandatory**.

What would happen if RIS Student tests positive for COVID-19?

With regard to any reported **positive confirmed COVID-19** case at School, the instructions are to be followed as per **DHA Protocol**.

- 1) The **DHA** would **be informed** and would make **contact with the Family**.
- 2) The **DHA** would allocate the **Investigation Team** and together with the **School Health and Safety Team** would trace **Close Contacts**.
- 3) **Student** would have to **quarantine for 14 days** and symptoms would be monitored.
- 4) **Student** who is in **home isolation** will continue his/her education through **Distance Learning**.
- 5) School would monitor all the procedures that are put in place to ensure everyone's Health and Safety.
- 6) School is to prevent Students from bullying their peers who were diagnosed or suspected to have COVID-19.
- 7) The **School Nurse** will do a **virtual check up** with the **Affected Person / Close Contact** that he/she does not have any symptoms and are well. This will take place 1 to 2 days before rejoining the School.
- 8) If the Affected Person/Close Contact are given the **all clear during the virtual check-up**, he/she may return to School.
On arrival to School, he/she must attend the School Clinic before going into class where the Nurse will conduct a **final assessment** before being allowed to resume learning at School.
- 9) The child **cannot return to School** until they have **quarantined for 14 days**, have received a **negative PCR test result**, and being free of any symptoms. and have obtained the **Clearance Certificate from the treating healthcare facility** or from the **DHA** by calling **800588**.

IF SHOWING SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19:

- **Covid-19 symptoms** - *fever $\geq 37.50^\circ$, cough, body ache or fatigue, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, diarrhea and nausea, headache, loss of sense of smell or taste*
- A **School Policy** of "**Staying at Home if Unwell**" for students showing symptoms of Covid-19 should be enforced.
- Staying at home if sick is the best thing to do in order to prevent spread of COVID-19.
- If feeling unwell, it's critical to stay at home and recover.
- If a student shows **symptoms of Covid-19 while at School**, he/she will be **instantly isolated** to the designated medical room; the **Parent/Guardian** of

a Student will be **immediately notified** / the patient should be referred to the hospital to take necessary actions.

- If a Student/Staff Member shows **symptoms of Covid-19 while at home**, he/she must stay at home. Student's Parents / Guardians should inform the Health and Safety Officer / School Management.
- If a Student/Staff Member is identified as a **Close Contact to Covid-19** patient, he/she should stay at home (**14-day quarantine**) and monitor health.
- If waiting for COVID-19 test results, and/or instructed by DHA to self-isolate, the Student/Staff Member must do so immediately.

Covid-19 CASE DEFINITIONS:

- **Suspected Covid-19 case** is defined as the Patient who:
 - presents respiratory symptoms with or without fever $\geq 37.50^{\circ}$
 - with the International Travel History during the 14 days prior to symptom onset
 - been in contact with a confirmed Covid-19 case within 14 days
 - residing in a community setting where Covid-19 cases have been detected
 - cases of influenza-like illness without history of travel or known possible exposure.
- **Confirmed Covid-19 case** is defined as the Patient who:
 - has a positive polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test result for Covid-19 infection that is reported by an approved laboratory, irrespective of clinical signs and symptoms.

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES AND HEALTH EDUCATION FOR PARENTS:

Educate children about Covid-19 health and safety instructions:

- symptoms
- methods of transmission
- protection measures (*face masks, hand sanitizers, physical distance, sneezing and coughing etiquette*)
- daily healthy routine / precautionary behavior.
